NOTICES & WELCOME

In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

All Amen.

The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.

All And also with you.

The minister introduces the service, then a time of silence is kept

THE COLLECT

Heavenly Father, by the power of your Holy Spirit you give your faithful people new life in the water of baptism. Guide and strengthen us by the same Spirit, that we who are born again may serve you in faith and love, and grow into the full stature of your Son, Jesus Christ, who is alive and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit now and for ever.

All Amen.

the congregation is asked to Sit

BIBLE READING At the end of the bible reading, the person reading will say:

This is the Word of the Lord

All Thanks be to God.

HOMILY The priest gives a short talk before inviting the parents and godparents to stand on the step facing the congregation ready to make their promise on behalf of the child / candidate.

HYMN when the financial collection is taken for St James Church. Please encourage guests to complete a white gift-aid envelope for their donation. To collect in the offerings, please pass the collection bag along the row as directed by the wardens on duty at the service.

PRESENTATION OF THE CANDIDATESThe priest addresses the whole congregation first:

Faith is the gift of God to his people. In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome this child and uphold him/her in his/her new life in Christ?

All With the help of God, we will.

The parents and godparents are addressed by the priest and respond to the next two questions:

Parents and godparents, the Church receives this child with joy. Today we are trusting God for his /her growth in faith. Will you pray for him/her, draw him/her by your example into the community of faith and walk with him/her in the way of Christ?

All With the help of God, we will.

In baptism this child begins his/her journey in faith. You speak for him/her today. Will you care for him/her, and help him/her to take his/her place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

All With the help of God, we will. The priest addresses the congregation. All Stand. In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.

To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore, I ask:

All I reject them.

Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil? All I renounce them. Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

All I repent of them.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

All I turn to Christ.

Do you submit to Christ as Lord? Αll I submit to Christ. Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth, and the life? ΑII I come to Christ.

The candidate is signed with the Holy oil of Baptism on the forehead – the priest says:

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

The priest addresses the congregation:

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

Αll Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ against sin, the world, and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

The priest prays over the child(ren):

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

ΑII Amen. The parents and candidates now move to the font, at the centre back of the nave.

PRAYER OVER THE WATER

Praise God who made heaven and earth,

ΑII who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

Αll It is right to give him thanks and praise.

A seasonal prayer of blessing over the waters of the font is said by the priest. We use fresh warm water in the font for every baptism. The prayer ends with:

... to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever.

All Amen.

PROFESSION OF FAITH The whole congregation with parents and godparents join in.

I ask you to profess on behalf of these candidates the faith of the Church.

ΑII We believe in God the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named. We believe in God the Son, who lives in our hearts through faith and fills us with his love. We believe in God the Holy Spirit, who strengthens us with power from on high. Ephesians 3

We believe in one God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen.

BAPTISM

N, I baptise you in the name of the Father and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

ΑII

The child / candidate is now signed with Christ's name in the oil of holy Chrism, as a sign of the authority we receive under Jesus. (Alpha and Omega – beginning and end) Then the priest prays:

May God, who has received you by baptism into his Church, pour upon you the riches of his grace, that within the company of Christ's pilgrim people you may daily be renewed by his anointing Spirit, and come to the inheritance of the saints in glory.

Αll Amen.

WELCOME AND PEACE

There is one Lord, one faith, one baptism: by one Spirit we are all baptised into one body. (Therefore we say together)

ΑII We welcome you into the fellowship of faith; we are children of the same heavenly Father; we welcome you.

Prayers of intercession and the Lord's Prayer follow. Then a parent is presented with a lit candle on behalf of the child / candidate. (The light for this is taken from the Easter/Paschal Candle)

God has delivered us from the dominion of darkness and has given us a place with the saints in light. You have received the light of Christ; walk in this light all the days of your life.

Αll Shine as a light in the world to the glory of God the Father.

The service concludes with a prayer of blessing. Photos may be taken at this point, one family at a time.

Your Child's Baptism at St James in 2023

Thank you for your interest in having your child baptised at St James Weybridge. We really look forward to sharing in your celebration and hope these notes are useful as you prepare for your family occasion with us.

Baptism (Christening)

In baptism, we thank God for his gift of life and publicly acknowledge his love. In the Anglican Church (Church of England) it is common to baptise children and infants; this is sometimes known as christening (to "christen" means to "give a name to"). Baptism is one of the sacraments of the Church and a holy ritual to symbolise grace; a visible sign of something God does in our hearts. In the Christian tradition baptism can be traced back to Jesus himself being baptised in the river Jordan, by John (See Matthew 3: 13-17). So, baptism involves naming and marking a person with holy oil as God's child; they are then washed by water (poured over the head three times) in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit and finally given a candle to represent Easter and the new light of the risen Jesus.

When do services of baptism take place?

We usually hold a service of Holy Baptism on the 4th Sunday monthly at 12noon. (Sometimes Baptisms are included within the 10am Sung Parish Eucharist or Easter Day at 6am within the Easter Liturgy). Baptism is a **public rite** - it is not a private occasion, and the whole Christian church represented by St James congregation welcomes you and your children into the family of faith. We book up to three families per baptism service, with each allowed to invite 60 guests. (Do talk to us if you need to invite more, we may be able to accommodate this, if asked in advance).

What happens on the day of Baptism?

You need to arrive in good time before the start of the service, at the latest 15 minutes before we are due to stat. At St James our warden on duty will welcome you and your guests and hand out a service sheet and hymn book. A copy of the service text is attached to these notes. Where we join in together the words are printed in **Bold Type** with an *All* in the margin. The congregation have an important part in welcoming your child(ren) who are joining the family of the Church and therefore welcomed into membership. The congregation will promise to support and pray for you and your child.

We ask that Parents and Godparents sit on the front row of the church. If in doubt, the wardens on duty will show you know where to sit. The Baptism part of the Service takes place after the Sermon/talk. The priest will invite you and the Godparents to stand at the front of the church, facing the congregation at the appropriate time. Some parts of the service will be for the whole congregation to join in; some will be for you and the godparents. For the baptism itself, the parents and children are asked by the priest to gather around the font, which is at the back of the church. (The font is a large stone basin on a pedestal, containing the water for baptism).

Making decisions and promises

You will be asked to declare publicly on behalf of your child that you believe in God and that you will bring your child up to follow Jesus. You, and your Godparents (who must themselves have been baptised and be present at the service) will be asked to answer, on your child's behalf, that you have decided to turn to Christ. The declarations made by you and the child's godparents will be made in front of the church congregation. You will be asked:

Parents and godparents, the Church receives these children with joy. Today we are trusting God for their growth in faith. Will you pray for them, draw them by your example into the community of faith and walk with them in the way of Christ?

You answer: With the help of God, we will.

In baptism these children begin their journey in faith. You speak for them today. Will you care for them, and help them to take their place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

You answer: With the help of God, we will.

Frequently asked questions about Baptism

Q. What's the difference between a baptism and a christening?

These names are sometimes used interchangeable for the same service. Technically to "christen" means to name a child and baptism is the whole service, including the pouring of water over the child's forehead three times and one of the sacraments of the Church.

Q. What is the right age for baptism?

Baptism can happen at any age. What matters is that those concerned are committed to bring up a child as a Christian. Teenagers and adults may also be baptized. This is celebrated with confirmation by the Bishop. You can only be baptised once, but there are ways of renewing your Christian commitment publicly as an adult - your priest will be able to advise you.

Q. I'm not a regular churchgoer. Can I still have my child baptized?

Yes. The Church of England believes that God's love is available to all, regardless of their background. Fr Damian or one of our team can talk you through the options. You may also wish to find out more about the Christian faith and what joining the Church involves before you make a decision about baptism. At St James we run a regular course for enquirers each autumn. Do ask one of the team about this.

Q. What does it cost? How do I make a donation to support St James' Church?

The Church of England charges a small fee of £17 (from March 2023) towards the costs of the certificate and we ask for this to be paid in advance of the ceremony. There are no other charges for a service of Holy Baptism. However, at each service a collection is taken during the Hymn, and we ask you and your guests to be as generous as possible in supporting us in this way. Please help us by making your donation in one of our white gift-aid envelopes, completing the information required and dating the front. (Only those who pay income tax are eligible to claim gift-aid on their donations). There is also a contactless machine for card donations, located at the back of the church. Q. Who should I choose as Godparents and how many? Why do they need to have been baptised? Traditionally each child has three godparents. Godparents should have already been baptised because they are making Christian promises before God and have a special "Christian" role. It's about helping a child to come to know God, encouraging them in their spiritual life and supporting them in their membership of the local church. During the service the priest asks Godparents, as well as parents to declare their intention to support the child. The priest asks if they are 'prepared to walk with [the child] in the way of Christ' and will 'help them take their place within the life and worship of Christ's Church'. God parents need to be able to answer honestly 'Yes' to each of these questions.

Q. Where do my guests park their cars when attending St James?

We recommend using the Churchfields Car Park which is accessed from The High Street and has ample parking. It is a pay and display so be aware that parking charges may apply. A Prayer to pray with your child

Heavenly Father, thank you for the gift of [child's name] and for all the joy he/she brings us. Be with her/him on her/his Christian journey so she/he may come to know our Lord Jesus Christ as Saviour and friend. Amen.
